SEXUALLY REACTIVE YOUTH

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Overview:

- **General Philosophy:** Strength-based, Positive Youth Development
- **Non-Secure:** Staff supervision 24/7. Doors are not locked on egress
- **Population:** Males, ages 12-18 (admission prior to 18th birthday), who have sexually offended, engaged in sexually abusive behavior or have a history of sexually reactive behaviors
- **Group:** Placement in a group determined by age, maturity, committing offense and established treatment needs.
- **Program length:** Varies by individual treatment needs

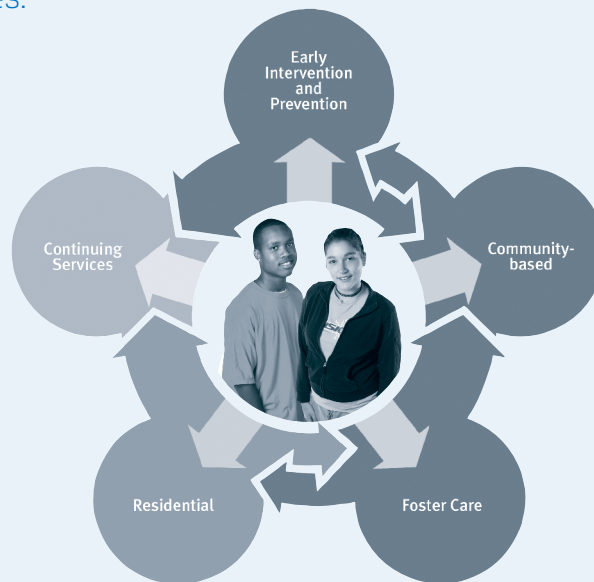
Psycho-educational treatment model:

- **Group Meetings:** Monday through Friday. Led by Senior Clinician.
- **Life Space Crisis Management:** Staff trained to assess student's "conflict cycle" and determine appropriate interventions to help youth link feelings and behaviors with impact upon self and others.
- **Pathways:** Twice weekly sexual offender specific therapy co-facilitated by Senior Clinician and Relapse Prevention Specialist.
- **Safe Crisis Management:** Comprehensive training program focused on preventing and managing crisis events and improving safety in agencies and schools. SCM has a trauma-sensitive approach with emphasis on building positive relationships with individuals.
- **Trauma-Informed Care:** Staff are trained in techniques through The National Institute for Trauma and Loss in Children (TLC) to help youth who have been subjected to traumatic events.
- **Education:** Year-round, on-campus school. Teachers, reading specialist, social worker, school psychologist, special education services, resource consultant and educational director employed by Calhoun Intermediate School District. Structured PE classes, special campus activities and on-grounds Adventure Education provided.
- **Spiritual Development and Fine Arts:** Each student is provided the opportunity to meet spiritual needs and develop artistic ability in both on- and off-ground programs, including the All Starr Choir, a student group comprised of talented singers and musicians.
- **Relapse Prevention Worker/Home Visits:** Each youth and family is assigned a Relapse Prevention Specialist (RLPS). The RLPS has the responsibility to meet with and help the family define goals and work toward the student's treatment completion. The RLPS will work with the Treatment Team, family and referring worker to develop a Relapse Prevention Plan, including post-placement living, services and structure. Visits are encouraged, coordinated and approved by the referring worker.

- **Service Learning:** Structured volunteer activities to help students build self-efficacy, improve self-concept and encourage citizenship.
- **Psychiatric Services:** When appropriate, youth will be referred for Starr's psychiatric evaluation and treatment services provided by a board-certified child and adolescent psychiatrist.
- **Medical and Dental Services:** Medical needs are met by a full-time RN. Licensed physician sees youth by appointment and serves as medical director. Emergency medical care provided at local community hospital. Licensed dental care provided by on-campus and local community providers.
- **Dietary/Food Services:** Using menus developed by a registered dietician, students/staff prepare meals.
- **Substance Abuse Education and Counseling:** Offered to students when appropriate.
- **Life Skills:** Formal assessment and training through the Ansell Casey Life Skills Program as well as informal education and training in the development of life skills for each student.
- **Continuing Services:** For each student, a written reintegration plan is created by the student, family and referring worker. Continuing Services are provided for up to one year post-placement.
- **Transportation:** Youth and their families are provided transportation services to accommodate home visits, court hearings and campus meetings and visits.
- **Scholarships:** Post-secondary academic scholarships are available. Students must apply by the posted deadline and be in good academic standing to be considered.
- **Cultural Competence:** Cultural diversity is evident in all of Starr's programs, and Starr staff work with youth to promote a loving and accepting atmosphere.

Starr provides a comprehensive continuum of programs that meet the individual needs of youth and families at every stage – from residential to foster care to community-based – with family-centered and child-focused services.
