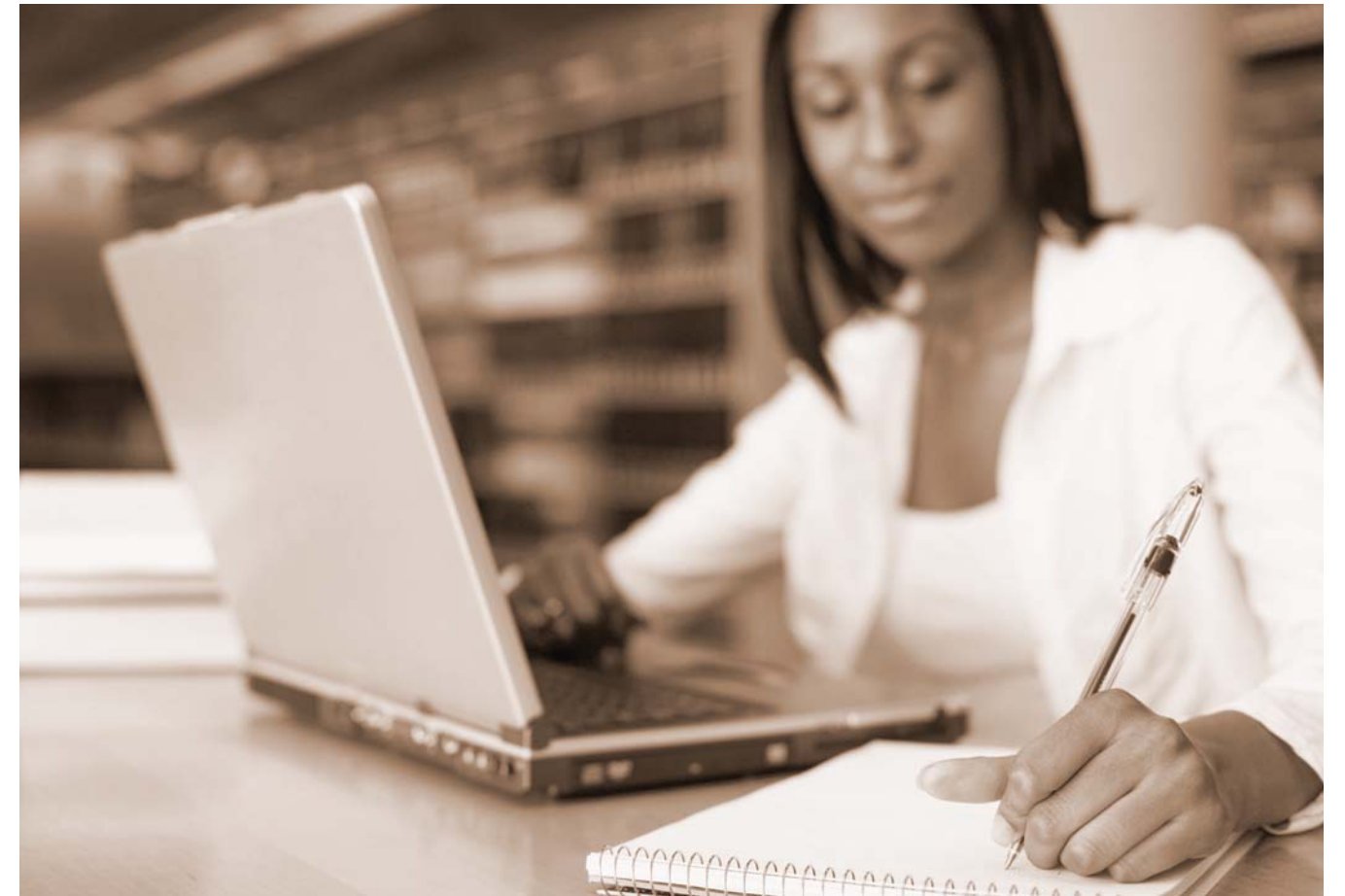
Starr students advance an average of 2-3 years in math and English during a one-year stay. Our year-round programming makes a difference!

Tom and Ryan had a lot in common when they first came to Starr. Both had anger problems and had been in trouble with the law. They also liked to work with their hands. As cottage-mates

with half a dozen other boys their age, Tom and Ryan were wary of each other but eventually discovered their shared talent for fixing things. The other guys in the cottage noticed, too, and it wasn't long before they began counting on Tom and Ryan for repairs and other "fix-it" projects around the cottage. When their outdoor grill showed signs of rusting, Tom and Ryan not only helped repair it but even helped the other cottages refurbish theirs. At Starr, kids learn that when they help others, they help themselves. It's an approach that changes hearts – and lives.

Starr students live in groups of 10-14 in cottages on our campuses. Students live in 26 cottages, 10 independent living apartments and 36 apartment units.

else in Lewis and they helped him see it, too. By appointing him to student council, the staff gave him a healthy outlet where he could exercise his natural leadership skills. Says Lewis, “Involvement in student council and other extra-curricular activities is positive to both myself and other students. I am also looking forward to starting bass guitar lessons soon and hope it will prove to be as positive an experience as student council has been.”

Bobby's family didn't know what to do. Their son was belligerent and verbally abusive to everyone – teachers, parents, siblings. He openly scorned the faith he'd been raised in and refused to go to church

for any reason. It broke their hearts – and there was more heartbreak to come. When a series of petty crimes landed Bobby in court, he was referred to Starr's residential treatment program. There, Bobby discovered a talent for working with clay through Starr's Ministry Arts program. For him, it was a powerful transition that "made the invisible visible." His mom remembers the turning point for her son. "On a visit home during his treatment, Bobby asked if he could be the one to say the prayer before dinner." Sometimes discovering the creator inside can help students reconnect with the Creator above.

At Starr, spiritual growth is an inseparable part of life. Our spiritual programs, including our visual arts and museums, are funded wholly with private contributions.

Tom's mother pulls no punches. "I was a drug addict, an alcoholic and in an abusive relationship. Tom saw it all." When she was sent to prison for 14 months, her angry and frightened son started hanging out with a dangerous crowd, vandalizing property and worse. Much worse. He ended up at Starr Commonwealth for treatment and care. Eighteen months later, Tom was a new boy. "He was different on the inside," says his mother who has been clean and sober now for 3 years. Tom graduated from Starr in 2004. At the graduation ceremony, as the graduates were introduced, Tom talked about his new start and how proud he was of his mother's new start, too. They both got a standing ovation.

Students arrive at Starr having lived in some less than ideal environments. By providing a nurturing environment and meeting basic needs, we are telling them that "they're worth it." We don't just change behaviors, we change values.

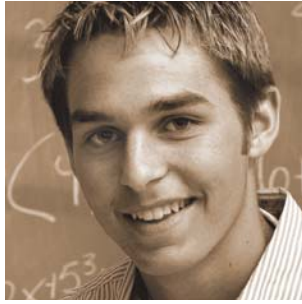

their Starr counselors agreed to see what they could do for a neighbor whose property had been hit pretty hard. After a long trek through a muddy field, the team helped clear out a mile-long swath of damage and debris. It was quite an experience, especially for kids from more urban environments who had never experienced life in the country. "They couldn't believe the mud!" laughs their counselor. "I told them, what better way to get your feet muddy than by helping other people."

When Ralph's mother

died of an overdose, he was placed in a variety of programs, one worse than the next. When his glasses broke, they refused to replace them with "normal" glasses and instead gave him ugly, goggle-style glasses to wear. Then Ralph came to Starr. He was frightened at first but eventually Starr's loving attention, which included buying him normal, regular-looking glasses, made him feel safe enough to connect with others and even make friends.

Ben was a teenage boy who could do no right, at least in his own eyes. He had Asperger's Syndrome which made it very difficult to connect with others. He was shy, quiet and had never had

any friends. "In his previous placement, they did a good job of crisis control but there was just no help with the emotional piece," says his father. The family knew that Ben needed to be able to reach outside himself and connect with others, particularly those in his own age group. They were impressed that Ben received letters from several Montcalm boys before he even came to the school. The bonds that have been created since are real and powerful. "When he was home at Christmas he told us he needed to call one of the boys back at the school because he said, 'Mom, he'll be missing me.' Then he said he might be on the phone for awhile because all the other guys would want to talk to him, too."

Then they discovered the residential treatment program for girls at Starr Commonwealth. LeeAnne and her mother admit the transition hasn't been without its difficulties. But both agree that the way Starr approached those difficulties made all the difference. "I saw huge changes even after just a month," says her mom. In fact, LeeAnne was chosen to introduce the annual Founder's Day speaker to an audience of hundreds. "If you'd told me two months ago that LeeAnne would be standing up to speak in front of a crowd, I wouldn't have believed it. She's come so far."

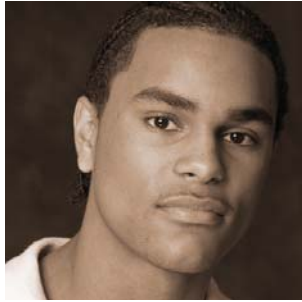

Billy is an 18-year-old student at Kellogg Community College in Battle Creek, Michigan. He has a job, pays his own rent and is doing very well in school. In fact, Billy isn't a whole lot

different from other young college students at KCC and that's exactly what makes his story so wonderful. Billy's early years were spent mostly in trouble and his home situation was difficult at best. At age 14, he came to live at Starr Commonwealth where the program's strength-based treatment focus began to heal his broken sense of self. Eventually, Billy was placed with a Starr foster family and continued to bloom. Starr Commonwealth was able to give Billy a childhood. A Starr college scholarship is giving him his future.

When we talk about the Starr family, we're really talking about lots of families. And not just the families we've helped through the years, but those who have helped us.

Charles Norton of Ann Arbor, Michigan was an educator and author who was first introduced to Starr by one of his students. Norton was intrigued by stories of this remarkable charity and decided to visit the campus himself. What he saw affected him profoundly – so much so, in fact, he thought about Starr when he came into a significant inheritance.

But Charles Norton had a family, including three children who would inherit his estate one day. It's all for one and one for all, he decided. If the family agreed to donate the money for a new cottage at Starr, then so be it. If not, well then, that would be that. Norton was so pleased with his family's final decision that he made a request: the cottage should be named for them all. Dedicated in 1956, Norton Family Cottage stands as a testament to the strength of a generous family – a legacy that continues at the Albion campus.
